RESOLVE in Favor of Township No. 10.

Appropriation for road in township No. 10. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, in favor of township No. 10 in Hancock County, \$3000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1934, to aid in repairing and building the road leading from Franklin to Cherryfield, in Black's woods, so-called, beginning at the eastern end of Fox Pond and extending easterly to the top of Catherine's Hill so-called, to be expended under the direction of the state highway commission from the general highway fund.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Catherine's Hill is about a mile long, is dangerous and narrow and is in bad shape. Subject to heavy travel.
