STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Licensing of Operators of Milk Gathering Stations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 210, § 2, amended. Chapter 210 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby allocated as sections 42-A to 42-I inclusive, of chapter 42 of the revised statutes, and section 42-B thereof is hereby amended by adding at the end of said section the following paragraph:

'Any such applicant for a license under the provisions of this chapter shall not be required to file the bond hereinbefore provided for, or to deposit any money or securities in lieu thereof, as hereinbefore provided, if all of the persons who sell milk or cream to said applicant for license consent in writing that such bond or security be not given, and if such written agreement is duly executed and filed with the commissioner. Such applicant for license shall file with the commissioner a list showing the names and address of all the persons from whom he is purchasing milk or cream, and if after the filing of such list, other persons sell milk or cream to such applicant, said applicant shall notify the commissioner of the names and post office addresses of said persons within 5 days after he commences so to purchase milk and cream of said persons.'
