STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Permitting the Building of a Bridge Between Southport and Capitol Island.

Emergency Preamble. Whereas, many residents of Southport and Capitol Island are out of employment; and

Whereas, the following suggested project would furnish employment; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, now, therefore

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Bridge between Southport and Capitol Island, permitted. Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary, the officers of the Capitol Island Association and Wilbur N. Grover of Southport are hereby authorized and empowered to construct and maintain a foot-bridge over tide water from the north end of the private way on Capitol Island to the east end of the private way of Wilbur N. Grover in Southport, the said bridge to be not less than 8 feet in width and 220 feet in length and 8 feet above mean high tide.

Emergency Clause. In view of the emergency created as recited in the preamble this act shall take effect when approved.
