STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Mirrors on Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 29, § 113, amended. Section 113 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 113. Mirror must be attached to motor vehicle which are so constructed or loaded that operator does not a clear view to rear. No person shall operate upon any public way any taxicab, commercial motor vehicle motor truck, or trailer so constructed, equipped, loaded, or used that the driver or operator is prevented from having a constantly free and unobstructed view of the highway immediately in the rear, unless there is attached to the vehicle a mirror or reflector so placed and adjusted as to afford the operator a clear, reflected view of the highway in the rear of the vehicle, for a distance of at least 50 feet. Such mirror or reflector shall measure at least six inches in diameter or length...

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
