STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Provide a Bonus for the Encouragement of Agriculture and Industry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Bonus of 2% provided for certain products. Every person, firm or corporation which sells textile products, including clothing, bedding, fabrics and products of the loom; foods produced and products of the soil, including cereals, vegetables, poultry, eggs, milk, cream, cheese and butter; manufactured products, including machinery, newsprint, paper, boots or shoes; building materials, including bricks, lumber, lime, mortar and cement, paint, oils and wallpaper; canned goods; livestock; sea foods, including fresh-water fish, shrimps, sardines, clams, scallops, lobsters and other shell fish; birds and mammals; toys, sweets, tobacco and tobacco products; flowers, seeds, trees, shrubs and nursery stock, shall, annually, upon the 1st day of July of each calendar year, draw a stipend of 2% of all sales of said commodities produced and sold within the state, during the previous year, to be paid from a special appropriation to be made by the governor and council from unassigned funds.
