STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Attorney-General.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 125, § 6, amended. Section 6 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 94 of the public laws of 1931, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 6. The attorney-general. The attorney-general shall have an office in the state capitol and shall receive an annual salary of \$4000 \$6000, in full for all services and in lieu of all fees, except costs awarded under section 6 of chapter 77. He shall receive his actual expenses incurred in the performance of his official duties while away from his home.'
