STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Schooling of Children on Government Reservations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 136, amended. Section 136 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 136. State to cooperate with U. S. government for schooling of children on government reservation. Special arrangements may be made to provide elementary school privileges in cooperation with the United States government for a child or children residing with a parent or legal guardian at any light station, fog warning station, life saving station, or other place within a United States government reservation, under such rules and regulations as may be made by the state commissioner of education and approved by the governor and council. When no such special arrangements are made and such children desire to attend the elementary schools of a town adjacent to such reservation, the tuition of such children shall be paid by the state in accordance with the proportional cost per pupil of the school attended unless a rate of tuition is otherwise agreed upon.'
