AN ACT Relating to the Trapping Law in Waldo County.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Sec. 1. R. S., c. 38, § 72, amended.** Section 72 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended so that the first paragraph thereof shall read as follows:

'Whoever from the 1st day of February to the 15th day of November, both days inclusive, hunts or traps any fur-bearing animal except wild hares and rabbits (which are protected under the provisions of section 71 of this chapter), bob-cats, loup cervier, Canada lynx, or muskrat, within the counties of Androscoggin, Cumberland, York, Kennebec, ~~Waldo~~ and Knox; except that it shall be lawful to hunt foxes with a dog and gun from November 16th to February 15th, both days inclusive, in the counties of Cumberland, York, Androscoggin, Kennebec ~~and Knox and Waldo~~; provided further, that in Lincoln and Sagadahoc counties trapping for foxes shall be lawful from November 16th to December 15th, both days inclusive, and hunting for foxes with dog and gun shall be lawful from November 16th to February 15th, both days inclusive; or whoever from the 1st day of February to the 15th day of October, both days inclusive, hunts or traps any fur-bearing animal except wild hares and rabbits (which are protected as aforesaid), bob-cats, loup cervier, Canada lynx, or muskrat, within the counties of Washington, Hancock, Aroostook, Penobscot, Piscataquis,

Franklin, Somerset, **Waldo** and Oxford; or whoever has in possession at any time any fur-bearing animal or part or parts thereof taken in closed season, shall be subject to the penalties of this chapter.'
