STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Payment of Tuition by Towns.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 84. Tuition payable by towns under section 93. A town, precinct, or union maintaining a high school, as provided in class A of section 83, shall not be obliged to pay tuition under section 93 of this chapter. A town, precinct, or union maintaining a high school as provided in class B of section 83 or a junior high school as provided in the same section shall not be obliged to pay tuition for any pupil until he has completed that part of the course of said school approved by the state commissioner of education, or the equivalent thereof. Provided, that where a pupil has been accepted for attendance in a high school which provides educational facilities of a different nature and which in the judgment of the superintendent and of the commissioner of education are better adapted to the pupil concerned, the town, precinct, or union shall be obliged to pay tuition under section 93 of this chapter, whether or not it maintains a high school, and may, on vote of the town, pay transportation of such pupil, or subsistence in lieu of transportation.
