IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Creating a Recess Committee on Compulsory Liability Insurance for Motor Vehicles.

Recess committee on compulsory liability insurance for motor vehicles, created. Resolved: That there be and hereby is created a legislative recess committee to consist of 2 members of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate and 3 members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House which committee shall be known as the "Committee on Compulsory Liability Insurance." Said committee shall meet as soon as convenient after appointment and organize by electing a chairman and secretary.

Said committee shall consider and investigate the necessity and desirability of legislation designed to indemnify persons injured by the wrongful act of impecunious drivers of motor vehicles upon the streets and highways of this state.

Said committee shall consider and study similar laws existing in other states and countries and determine, so far as possible, the success experienced thereunder.

Said committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the 88th legislature, and in the event that said committee finds it desirable that such legislation be enacted it shall draft a bill or bills for that purpose and have same presented to the 88th legislature. Members of said committee shall receive their actual expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties as members thereof, said expenses to be approved by the governor and council.
