AN ACT Relating to Number of Lines Permitted in Ice Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 28A, additional; relating to number of lines permitted in ice fishing. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section to be numbered 28A.

Sec. 28A. Ice fishing regulated. Any person legally licensed may fish through the ice in the daytime with not more than 5 set lines, when under the immediate supervision of the person fishing, in any waters that are open to ice fishing and in the night time for cusk, in any waters open for cusk fishing in the night time. Any person who violates the provisions of this section shall be subject to the provisions of section 107.

All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
