STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Provide for the Temporary Filling of Vacancies in the Office of Sheriff.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- **Sec. 1.** Sheriff to appoint chief deputy. The sheriff in each county shall, as soon as may be after he takes office, appoint a chief deputy to serve under him who shall have all the powers and duties of a deputy sheriff and who shall be subject to the direction of the sheriff in the administration of his office.
- Sec. 2. Chief deputy to serve as sheriff, in event of vacancy, until a new sheriff is qualified. In the event of a vacancy in the office of sheriff by reason of death, resignation or otherwise, said chief deputy shall, upon qualifying in the manner required for a sheriff, serve as sheriff of the county and shall have and be subject to all the rights, powers, liabilities, and duties of a sheriff until a successor to the office of sheriff shall have been duly appointed or elected and qualified according to law.
- Sec. 3. R. S., c. 94, § 12, repealed. Section 12 of chapter 94 of the revised statutes and all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
