**RESOLVE, Relative to the Taking of Smelts for Food Purposes from the
Crooked and Songo Rivers.**

Smelt taking in Crooked and Songo rivers regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening that portion of the Crooked and Songo rivers in the towns of Naples and Casco which is now open for the taking of smelts under 6 inches in length for live bait, to the taking of smelts under 6 inches in length with a dip-net for food purposes by the legal residents of the towns of Naples and Casco with a daily bag limit of 6 quarts per person, 12 quarts per family per season; and the commissioner may promulgate such further rules and regulations as he may deem necessary to carry the provisions of this resolve into effect and prevent the abuse of the privileges granted thereunder.
