IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Amend the Charter of the York Beach Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., c. 129, § 14, amended. Section 14 of chapter 129 of the private and special laws of 1917 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 14. Subsequent meetings, how called; special meetings; date of annual meeting. Said assessors shall call all subsequent meetings of the corporation by posting up notices thereof, in 2 public and conspicuous places within the limits of said corporation, signed by them and stating the time and place of each meeting, 7 days at least before the time appointed for the meeting. All notices shall state in distinct article the business to be acted upon at the meeting, and no other business shall be then and there acted upon. When 10 or more voters in writing request the assessors to insert a particular article in any notice they shall insert it in their next notice issued, or shall call a special meeting for the consideration thereof to be held within 30 days after the filing of said written request. The annual meeting for the election of officers, excepting perhaps the first meeting for the election of officers, shall be held on the ~~second~~ last Monday of ~~August~~ **September** in each year. In case the assessors unreasonably neglect or refuse to call a meeting, any justice of the peace may call a meeting of the corporation on petition of 10 legal voters, by posting up notices in the manner herein provided.'
