STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Amending the Duty of Innkeepers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 36, § 5, amended. Section 5 of chapter 36 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 5. Duty of innkeepers to provide entertainment. Every innkeeper shall, at all times, be furnished with suitable provisions and lodging for strangers and travelers, and with stable room, hay, and provender for their horses and eattle; and with pasturing, if it is required by the terms of his license; and he shall grant such reasonable accommodations as occasion requires, to strangers, travelers, and others.'
