STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Admission to Normal Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 188, as amended by P. L., 1933, chapter 72, relating to qualifications of normal school students, amended. Section 188 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes as amended by P. L., 1933, chapter 72, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 188. Applicants for admission, qualifications; tuition. Applicants for admission ~~shall be 17 years of age, and~~ shall signify their intention to become teachers. The trustees shall charge \$100 for tuition to non-residents of the state, and \$50 for tuition to residents of the state. They may permit not exceeding 10% of the enrolment of residents to pay their tuition charges at such future dates as the trustees may determine.'
