STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Transportation of Poultry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Transportation of poultry regulated. Chapter 39 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by re-numbering section 10-C as 10-E and by adding thereto the following sections to read as follows :

'Sec. 10-C. Special investigator. The commissioner of agriculture shall appoint a suitable person as a special investigator to check up complaints of violations of sections 10-A to 10-E and to carry out the provisions of said sections. The investigator shall have the powers of a state police officer to make arrests, etc., in line with violations of sections 10-A to 10-E. He shall receive a salary of \$3000 per year.'

'Sec. 10-D. Out of state buyers to give bond. All poultry buyers from without the state shall give a bond to the state in the sum of \$500 conditioned on the compliance with all provisions of sections 10-A to 10-E, and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder. The commissioner is hereby empowered to make rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of section 10-A to 10-D, inclusive.'
