STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relative to the Planting of Fish in Inland Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, additional; relating to the planting of fish in inland waters. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 36-A and to read as follows:

'Sec. 36-A. No person, firm, corporation, department head or employee of the state of Maine shall deposit or plant any fish or fish spawn obtained from or raised by the state of Maine or the Federal Government in any inland waters of this state within a distance of 20 miles of any saw mill, wood working plant or factory, which deposits in inland waters, or on the banks thereof, in such manner that the same may fall or be washed into such waters any slabs, edgings, sawdust, chips, bark, mill waste, shavings or fibrous materials created in the manufacture of lumber or other wood products, or so deposit any oil regardless of its source.'
