STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Transportation of Moose, Elk and Caribou.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 60, amended. Section 60 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 60. Hunting and transportation of moose, elk and caribou prohibited; permission shall be received before importation. No person shall hunt, transport, or have in his possession any caribou, elk, or moose, or parts thereof.

Provided, however, that the commissioner upon application of any person who has legally killed a caribou, elk, or moose beyond the limits of this state may issue a license permitting the importation of such caribou, elk, or moose for consumption or mounting, but not for sale.'
