STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT relating to examination of employees by physician of employer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 55, § 21, amended. Section 21 of chapter 55 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in place thereof, to read as follows:

'Sec. 21. Examination of employee. Every employee shall, after an injury, in the city or town where he resides or where he is confined for treatment by any physician, at all reasonable times during the continuance of his disability, if so requested by his employers, submit himself to a physician or surgeon authorized to practice as such under the laws of this state, to be selected and paid by the employer. The employee shall have the right to have a physician or surgeon selected and paid for by himself present at the examination. If a physician provided by the employee is not present at said examination, it shall be the duty of the employer to file with the commission a copy of the report of its examining physician if and when any subsequent hearings relative to the rights of the parties arise.'
