STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Use of Materials in Construction of Public Projects.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Maine materials to be used in public projects. Whenever the construction, improvement, repair or maintenance of any highway, bridge, public building, or other public construction project in the state is to be put up for bidding thereon or contracted therefor, the public officials of the state or any political subdivision thereof in charge of the proposals for the bids or the contracting shall stipulate in the proposals for the bid or in the contract (I) that the raw materials to be used, such as sand, gravel, rock, stone, granite, wood, and lumber be purchased in the state; and (2) that products of Maine industries manufactured from materials that are available in this state shall be used whenever they may be obtained at the same or lower cost.

Whenever the state or any political subdivision thereof constructs, improves, repairs or maintains any highway, bridge, public building, or other public construction project in the state, (I) the raw materials to be used such as sand, gravel, rock, stone, granite, wood, and lumber shall be obtained in the state, and (2) products of Maine industries manufactured from materials that are available in this state shall be used whenever they may be obtained at the same or lower cost as those from other sources.
