STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Abolishment of the Governor's Council.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Governor's council abolished. Wherever in the statutes and the laws of the state the words "and council," "council," "governor's council," "by and with the consent of the council," and similar phrases referring to the governor's council appear, they shall be stricken out. Wherever in the statutes and laws, rights, powers and duties are conferred on the governor and council or the council they are hereby transferred to the governor. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the legislature to delete from the laws all references to the governor's council and transfer all their rights, powers and duties to the governor.
