STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section 386 of Chapter I of the Public Laws of 1933 Relating to Girls at State School for Girls.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 1, § 386, amended. Section 386 of chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 386. Duties of department; may bind to service any girl committed to its charge or parole to bureau of social welfare. The department shall have all the powers as to the person, property, earnings, and education of every girl committed to the charge of said department during the term of her commitment, which a guardian has to his ward, and all powers which parents have over their children. At the discretion of said department, any such girl, during her commitment, may be kept at said school, or entrusted to the care of any suitable person and may be required to work for such person, for a period not exceeding the term of her commitment, on such conditions as said department may deem reasonable and proper; or she may be entrusted to the custody of the bureau of social welfare, in which case, the expense of her maintenance and education shall be borne in accordance with the provisions of section 206 of this chapter.'
