STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Provide for the Union of Towns for the Employment of Social Welfare Workers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, amended. Chapter 33 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after section 14 the following section to be numbered 14-A:

'Sec. 14-A. Union of towns for the employment of social welfare workers. Subject to the approval of the commissioner of health and welfare, 2 or more towns may unite in the employment of a social welfare worker whose duty shall be to assist the overseers of the poor of such towns in the administration of poor relief, and their qualifications shall be prescribed by the department. Such worker shall devote his entire time to the performance of his duties and shall receive one-third of his salary and expenses, not exceeding \$600 per year, from the state, to be paid for from funds appropriated for the expense of state paupers.'
