## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

#### AN ACT to Amend Chapter I of the Public Laws of 1933 Relating to the Return of Insane Persons to the State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**P. L., 1933, c. I, amended.** Chapter I of the public laws of 1933 is hereby amended by inserting after section 407 the following section to be numbered 407-A:

'Sec. 407-A. Regulating the return of residents of Maine who have been committed to an institution for the insane or feeble-minded in another state. Whenever the department authorizes the return to this state of an insane or feeble-minded person who has been legally committed to an institution for the insane or to an institution for the feeble-minded in another state, such person may be received by the superintendent of the Augusta State Hospital or the Bangor State Hospital, if insane, or the Pownal State School, if feeble-minded, to be cared for as required by law; but no such person shall be so received unless he is accompanied by a copy of his original commitment certified by the superintendent of the institution to which he was committed.'
