STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend the Law Relating to Teachers' Pensions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 225, amended. Section 225 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 225. Commissioner of education to formulate rules. The state commissioner of education shall iormulate rules and regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of the six preceding sections; **Provided that in** case of retirement, voluntary or compulsory, on the part of a teacher, who has reached the age of 50, is needy, dependent, and has no other means of support the commissioner of education is authorized after due investigation to issue to such teacher a pension, the amount of which shall be one-half that to which such teacher would be entitled as determined by length of service set forth in this and the preceding six sections. Provided further that in case of total disability on the part of a teacher, who has reached the age of 50, and has no other means of support, the state commissioner of education is authorized after due investigation to issue to such teacher a pension, the amount of which shall be determined by the length of service as set forth in this and the preceding 6 sections, said teacher having complied with the conditions of the law relative to length of experience and to service within the state.'
