STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Admission to Normal Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 188, amended. Section 188 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 188. Applicants for admission; qualification; tuition. Applicants for admission shall be **at least** 17 years of age ~~and shall signify their intention to become teachers~~. The trustees shall charge \$100 for tuition to non-residents of the state and \$50 for tuition to residents of the state. They may permit not exceeding 10% of the enrolment of residents **at a normal school** to pay their tuition charges at such future dates as the trustees may determine.'
