**AN ACT to Permit Sunday Movies.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 39 of chapter 135 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto the following sections:

**'Sec. 39-G. Sunday movies legalized.** In any city or town that shall vote as hereinafter provided, it shall be lawful for any moving picture theater to have an exhibition of moving pictures on Sunday between the hours of 3 P. M. and 11:30 P. M.

**Sec. 39-H. Local option.** Section 39-G shall not be effective in any city until the municipal officers of a city so vote or in any town until an article in a town warrant so providing has been adopted at an annual town meeting. When a city or town has voted in favor of adopting the provisions of section 39-G said provisions shall be effective until repealed in the same manner as above provided.'
