**AN ACT Relating to Free Registration of Motor Vehicles Used for
Patriotic Purposes Only.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 29, § 58, amended. Section 58 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows :

'Sec. 58. State or municipal controlled motor vehicles to be registered free of charge. All motor vehicles owned and used by the state, or any municipal corporation therein, and all vehicles owned or controlled by any organization whose membership comprises only those members who hold honorable discharge from the U. S. Army, Navy, or Marine Corps, providing that vehicles so licensed by these patriotic organizations shall be used only for parades, or the transportation of its members to and from parades, conventions, fairs, or any patriotic or public gathering, shall be registered, but shall be exempt from the provisions of this chapter as to payment of registration fees ; but all such vehicles shall display registration plates as required by this chapter or approved by the secretary of state.'
