AN ACT Creating the Windham Game Preserve.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Windham game preserve, created. Windham. The following described territory known as the William Knight Estate, consisting of 156 acres more or less, situated in the town of Windham in the county of Cumberland; bounded and described as follows: beginning at the west corner of the estate extending along the Windham Plains road in a northerly direction to land owned by Frank Atherton, thence in an easterly direction along said Atherton's land to land owned by John LeGrow, thence in a southerly direction along said LeGrow's land to a cross road connecting the Gray road with the Windham Plains road, along said road for 40 rods, more or less in a northwest direction; thence in a southerly direction along lands owned by Sumner Varney, Walter Foster and George Foster, thence in a westerly direction along lands owned by George Foster, Sumner Varney and Charles Atherton to the point of beginning.

The commissioner is hereby authorized to extend the territory of this preserve upon petition of the owners of any contiguous territory.
