IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

RESOLVE, Relating to Taking and Sale of Clams in Scarborough.

Taking and sale of clams in Scarborough, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue the following rules and regulations:

(1) "No person shall buy, sell, give away, or expose for sale or possess for any purpose any clam dug or taken in the town of Scarborough, the shell of which is less than 2 inches in length, save that seed clams may be taken and possessed whatever the size may be, but no such seed clam shall be taken beyond the bounds of the town of Scarborough and all seed clams so dug or taken shall be returned to the flats within the bounds of said Scarborough within 24 hours of the time when dug or taken."

(2) "Whoever shall buy, sell, give away, expose for sale or possess any clam less than 2 inches in length except or provided by law, or whoever violates the rules and regulations provided herein in regard to seed clams shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days."
