STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Relative to Fishing in Rangeley Waters.

Fishing in Rangeley water regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game may issue a rule and regulation extending the season for fly fishing with a daily limit of 1 fish per person to October 15, in the following waters, Rangeley Lake, Mooselucmeguntic Lake, Cupsuptic Lake, including stream up to forks of Kennebago River and Rangeley Stream, Gull Pond, Dodge Pond, Loon Lake and Quimby Pond in the counties of Franklin and Oxford; also making it unlawful to fish on spawning beds in the above named waters.
