# STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

#### AN ACT to Regulate the Shipment of Clams Outside the State During Certain Periods.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Shipment of clams; penalty for violation. No person, firm or corporation shall, between the 1st day of June and the 15th day of September following, ship, transport, offer for shipment or transportation any clams beyond the limits of the state, except clams which have been canned, packed or barrelled between the 15th day of September and the 1st day of June.

Any person, firm or corporation, violating any provision hereof is subject to a fine of \$3 per bushel for any clams shipped, transported or offered for shipment.

All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
