STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Government of the Town of Harpswell.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Harpswell to vote in 3 districts. At any annual town meeting, or at a special town meeting of the voters of the town of Harpswell, under an appropriate article in the warrant calling such meeting, said voters, for the purposes of the election of the officers hereinafter mentioned, may vote to divide said town into 3 divisions to be denominated "Western Division", "Orrs and Bailey Division" and "Great Island Division" and to fix the boundaries of each such division.

Sec. 2. Election of certain officers regulated. At each annual town meeting held after the meeting mentioned in section I hereof; I selectman, I assessor and I overseer of the poor shall be elected, by a majority vote from each of said divisions, under the provisions of section 44 of chapter 5 of the revised statutes so far as the same may be applicable hereto.

Sec. 3. Validation of previous acts. The election of the selectmen in said town of Harpswell held March 5, 1934, as declared by the moderator of the town meeting, is hereby declared to be legal, valid and effective, and all acts done by said selectmen which would have been legal and

valid if the election of all of said selectmen had been legal and valid are hereby declared to be as legal, valid and binding as though all of them had been legally elected.
