STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Establish a Section of the Boundary Line Between Windham and Raymond.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Boundary line between Windham and Raymond established. That part of the boundary line between Windham and Raymond hereinafter described shall be, and hereby is, established as follows, to wit: Beginning at an old hard pine stump with iron pipe in center and a flat stone beside it, which is the southwest corner of Gray and Raymond, and being the point established by the commission appointed by the legislature in 1835, thence northwesterly approximately 3000 feet to a large boulder marked W. and R., thence southwesterly on the degree used at the time of incorporation of Windham, to the shore Jordon's Bay, Sebago Lake.
