STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Games of Sport on Armistice Day.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 135, § 44, amended. Section 44 of chapter 135 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 44. Public outdoor sports where admission is charged, on Memorial Day and Armistice Day; penalty. Whoever on Memorial Day before 3:30 o'clock in the afternoon, or on Armistice Day before 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon, engages in any public outdoor game of sport where an admission is charged or collection is taken shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$25 or by imprisonment for not more than 10 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Judges of municipal courts and trial justices shall have jurisdiction of all offenses under this section.'
