AN ACT Creating a Lien on Potatoes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 105, additional. Chapter 105 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 55-A, and to read as follows:

'Sec. 55-A. Lien on potatoes. Whoever labors at picking or harvesting potatoes has a lien on all the potatoes picked or harvested by him and his co-laborers for the amount due for his personal services, which takes precedence of all other claims except liens reserved to the state; such lien continues for 60 days after the last of such services are performed and may be enforced by attachment.'
