STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Bail Commissioner.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 113, § 34, amended. Section 34 of chapter 113 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 34. Bail commissioners appointed by court. The superior court, sitting in each county shall appoint from the number of justices of the peace resident in the county, I or more bail commissioners, who shall hold office during the pleasure of the court. All bail commissioners acting under an appointment by a justice of the supreme judicial court shall continue in office during the pleasure of the superior court. No judge of any municipal court or justice of the superior court shall receive any remuneration for services as bail commissioner.'
