STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Create State Supervising Architect.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sec. 1. State supervising architect; appointment; salary. The governor by and with the advice and consent of the council shall appoint and may at his pleasure remove the state supervising architect who shall receive an annual salary of \$5,000.

Sec. 2. State supervising architect to furnish bond. Before the said state supervising architect shall assume his duties he shall provide and deliver a bond with sufficient securities, subject to the approval of the state comptroller.

Sec. 3. To have custody of plans, records, etc. The said state supervising architect shall have an office in the state house and shall have the custody of all plans, specifications, apparatus, books and records pertaining to his department.

Sec. 4. May employ necessary assistants. Said state supervising architect may employ a private secretary, such draftsmen, tracers, clerks, stenographers and other assistants that may be needed and can be obtained within the limitation of the appropriation made therefor.

Sec. 5. To supervise plans of buildings constructed at expense of state. Said state supervising architect shall supervise and approve of all plans and specifications, material and workmanship pertaining to all new buildings constructed at the expense of the state, also supervise and approve plans and specifications and material for additions to the existing buildings and for the alterations and improvement thereof.

Sec. 6. Architect's duties subject to approval. All duties coming within the foregoing sections shall be subject to the approval of the governor and council.
