STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Require Constables and Colectors of Taxes to be Bonded by a Surety Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 14, § 14, amended. Section 14 of chapter 14 of the revised statutes, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 14. Bond of collector. The assessors shall require such constable or collector to give bond underwritten by a surety company authorized to do business in this state for the faithful discharge of his duty, to the inhabitants of the town, in such sum, and with such sureties, as the municipal officers approve; and the bonds of collectors of plantations shall be given to the inhabitants thereof, approved by the assessors, with like conditions.'

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
