AN ACT Relating to Clerk Hire in County Offices.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 125, § 46, amended. Section 46 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapters 27, 28 and 179 of the public laws of 1931, is hereby further amended by striking out said section and substituting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 46. Clerk hire in county offices. The several county treasurers shall pay weekly to the clerks employed by the several officials in their respective counties the wages to which they may be entitled and shall take their individual receipts therefor. County officials for whom provision for clerk hire may be made shall certify to the county treasurer the names of the clerks and the weekly wages at which they may be employed. Clerks shall be allowed a vacation not exceeding 2 weeks in any one year without loss of pay. The total sums to be paid to such clerks as wages shall be determined by the county commissioners in the several counties as a part of the county estimates required by section 66 of chapter 13. The county commissioners shall have power to make temporary transfers of such clerks from one office to another within the county whenever they deem it advisable for the more expeditious or economical despatch of the work of the county offices.'
