STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Liquor Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 301, § 6, amended. Section 6 of chapter 301 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 6. Violators of this act not to be licensed, within certain time. No person shall be eligible to be licensed under the terms of this act who has been convicted of the breach of any state or federal law ~~regulating~~ **relating to** the manufacture, sale, or transportation of intoxicating liquor, nor any artificial person whose officers or directors, or any of them, have been so convicted **within 5 years next prior to the filing of his or its application.'**
