## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

#### AN ACT Relating to the Sale of Liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Licenses for consumption sale. Section 3 of chapter 301 of the public laws of 1934 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 3. Licenses for consumption sale. Licenses for the sale of liquor to be consumed on the premises where sold may be issued in the discretion of the commission to clubs which have been in operation for a period of 2 full years prior to the application therefor and to bona fide hotels, restaurants, steamboats and railroad dining cars on payment of the fees herein provided subject, however, to the condition that the application therefor be approved by the municipal officers of the city or town in which such intended licensee, if operating a club, restaurant or hotel, is operating the same and subject to the further condition that licenses issued to restaurants shall be limited to malt liquor and wine. No liquor shall be sold under any license issued under the provisions of this section except during such hours as the dining room of the licensee is regularly open for the purpose of supplying food to guests except that hotel licensees may sell in the original packages to registered room guests.'
