## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Use of Reflectors on Commercial Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 29, § 82, amended. Section 82 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the 5th paragraph thereof the following paragraph:

'Every commercial motor vehicle having a carrying capacity of 2 tons or over shall be equipped with at least 1 adequate reflector securely attached to the rear thereof. Such reflectors may be a part of the rear lamp, and shall in all cases be red. No reflector shall be deemed adequate within the meaning of this section unless it is of a size and type approved by the secretary of state, and unless it is so designed, located and maintained as to be visible for at least 200 feet when opposed by a motor vehicle displaying lawful undimmed headlights at night on an unlighted highway.'
