STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Taking of Soft Shelled Clams.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Taking of soft shelled clams regulated. Whoever takes or has in his possession or offers for sale soft shelled clams less than 2½ inches in the longest diameter, to the amount of more than 5% of any batch, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$50 for each offense; provided however that the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries in his discretion may however issue permits to persons who take clam seed for propagation purposes.
