STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relative to the Salaries of State Officials and Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Effective date and limitation of this act. From the effective date of this act until July 1, 1937, the operation of acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act is hereby suspended and the provisions of this act shall remain effective during the aforesaid period of suspension.

Sec. 2. Salaries of \$3,000 a year or more reduced. The salaries of all state officials and employees, whether fixed by statute or otherwise shall be reduced by an amount based upon a rate of 10% on all salaries of \$3,000 per year and increasing in a sliding scale up to and including 20% on salaries of \$6,000 and over per year. All salaries of less than \$3,000 per year are hereby specifically exempted from any reduction by this act.

Sec. 4. Exception. The provisions of this act shall not apply to official salaries which the legislature has no authority to diminish nor to affect the retirement pay or pension rate of state employees and officials which the legislature has no authority to regulate.
