STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Sealers of Weights and Measures.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 126, additional Chapter 126 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after section 22, the following sections:

'Sec. 22-A. Penalty. Any person, firm, or corporation for whom scales, weights and measures or any weighing or measuring devices have been tested by a local sealer of weights and measures, who shall neglect or refuse to pay for said services rendered, or in any way violates any of the provisions of this chapter shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$50 for the 1st offense, and by a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 for each subsequent offense.'

'Sec. 22-B. Jurisdiction. Municipal courts and trial justices shall have original jurisdiction concurrent with the superior courts for actions brought for the recovery of penalties provided by this chapter and their prosecution for violation hereof.'
