STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-FIVE**

AN ACT Relating to Admissibility of Evidence Illegally Obtained.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Admissibility of evidence illegally obtained. In the trial of a criminal cause, the fact that evidence shall have been obtained illegally shall not render such evidence inadmissible.
