STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Failure of the Accused to Take the Stand in Criminal Cases.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Failure of defendant to take stand may be commented on. The failure of the accused to take the stand in the trial of a criminal cause may be commented on by counsel, and the jury may give consideration to such failure in arriving at a verdict.

Likewise in a trial without a jury the magistrate may take into consideration the failure of the accused to take the stand.
