### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE

#### AN ACT Relating to State's Prison for Women.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 1. Chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered section 354-A and to read as follows:

'Sec. 354-A. State prison for women to be at women's reformatory. The department shall cause to be set aside at the reformatory for women premises for the incarceration of all women now at state's prison and of all women henceforth committed to state prison. The premises so set aside shall be known as "the state prison for women" and all women incarcerated therein shall be subject to the same rules and regulations heretofore applicable to women inmates of state's prison. All women now serving sentence in the state prison shall, upon the approval of this act, be immediately transferred to the state prison for women to serve the remainder of the term of sentence under which said woman was committed to the state prison. No woman, or women, shall hereafter be committed to state's prison.'
